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




# A new EU Cancer Screening Scheme

Early detection through cancer screening **reduces the impact of cancer and saves lives.**

- ✓ Up-to-date **EU recommendations** based on the latest technology, scientific developments and evidence
- ✓ Updated and new **EU screening guidelines** and quality assurance schemes
- ✓ Improved **monitoring and exchange of data** through the European cancer information system


# What are the new EU recommendations?

Extending access to targeted cancer screening for breast, colorectal and cervical cancers along with a step-by-step approach to introducing prostate, lung and gastric cancer testing.

	<b>BREAST CANCER</b> suggesting a lower age limit of 45 and a higher age limit of 74 (standard 50 – 69), plus MRI scans when medically appropriate		HPV testing for women aged 30 to 65, every 5 years or more, to detect <b>CERVICAL CANCER</b> , taking account of HPV vaccination status		Triage testing for <b>COLORECTAL CANCER</b> in people aged 50 – 74 through faecal immunochemical testing (FIT) to determine follow-up via endoscopy/colonoscopy
	<b>LUNG CANCER</b> testing for individuals at high risk (i.e. smokers), incl. prevention approaches		Prostate specific antigen testing for <b>PROSTATE CANCER</b> in men, plus MRI scans for follow-up		In places with high <b>GASTRIC CANCER</b> incidence and death rates, screening for <i>Helicobacter pylori</i> and surveillance of precancerous stomach lesions

# From policy to action : related projects

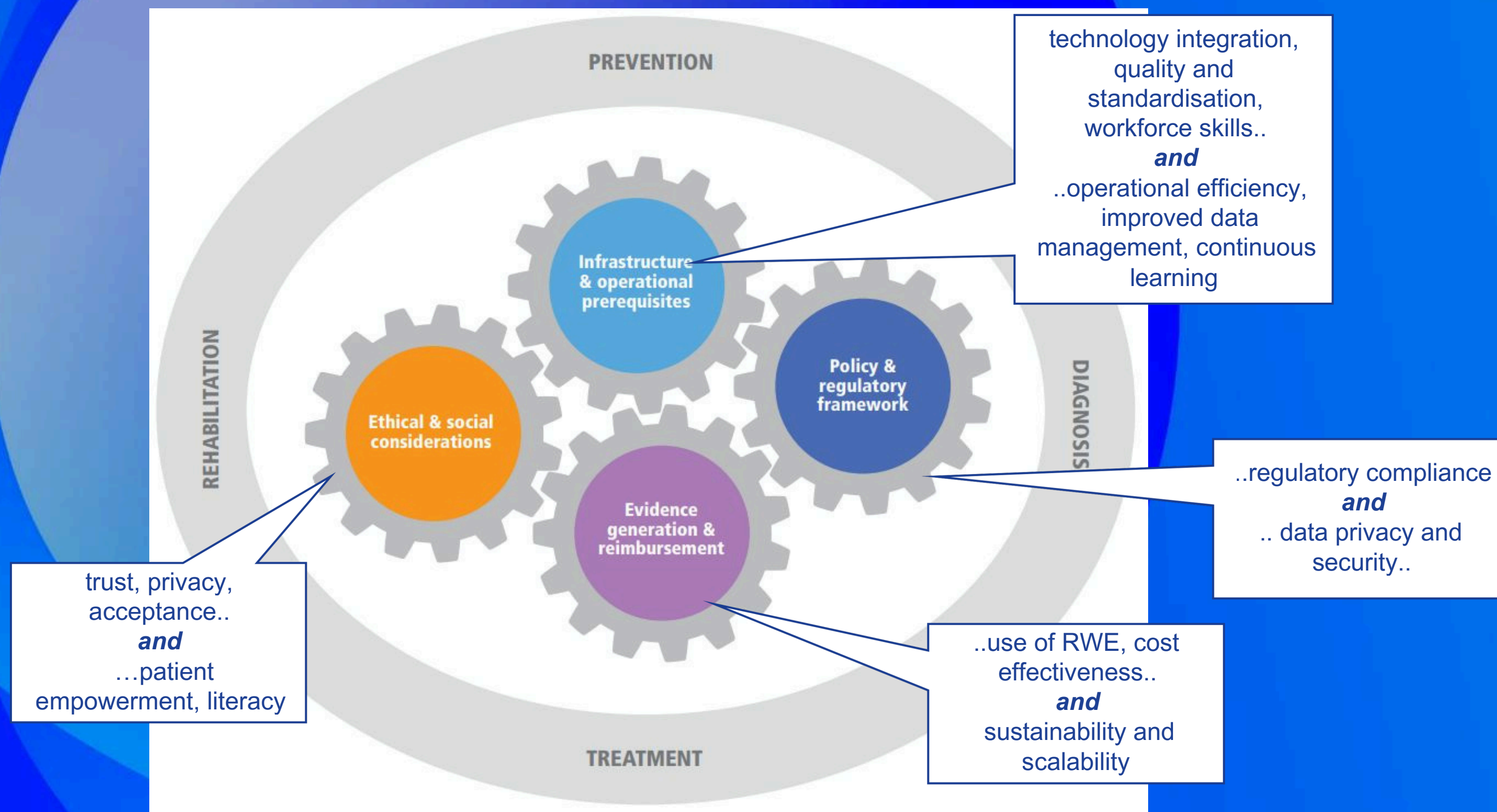
- **CanScreen-ECIS:** data collection to update ECIS and improve quality and coverage of cancer screening programmes in Europe (2022 – 2024) data feed into the 3rd EU cancer screening monitoring report (start end 2025)
- **Projects in support of new cancer sites:** TOGAS - gastric, SOLACE - lung, PRAISE U - prostate (2023 – 2026), follow up calls in EU4Health 2025
- **Joint Action EUCanScreen:** Assuring sustainable implementation of council recommendations (2024 – 2028)
- **#GetScreenedEU:** EU's campaign for cancer screening to help  raise



# Digitalisation and precision medicine

- **As part of EUCanScreen:** Exploring how to incorporate modern information technologies and AI in cancer screening programmes
- **European Cancer Imaging Initiative:** working towards creating a digital infrastructure linking up resources and databases of cancer imaging data across the EU
- **Joint Action on Cancer Personalised medicine:** lunch in the upcoming months, includes secondary prevention pillar and complements approaches to digitalisation and risk

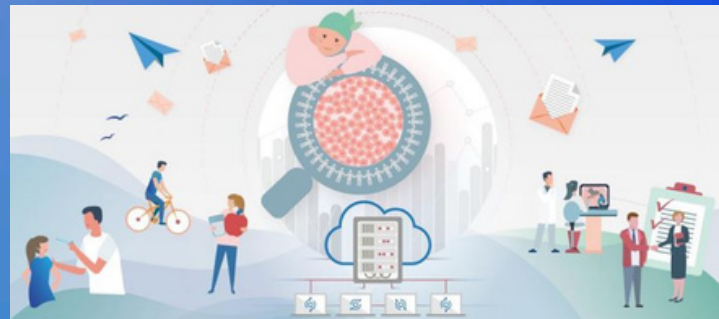




# Actionable recommendation
